



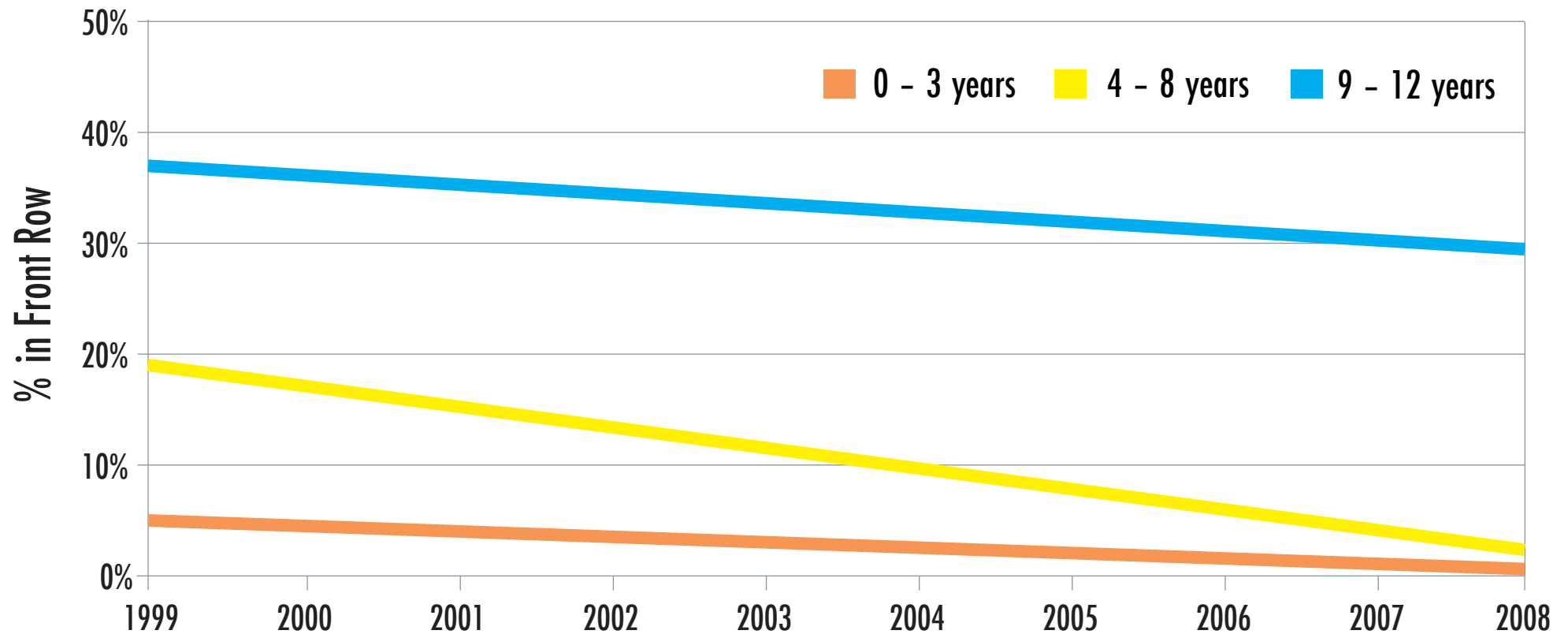

# Front Row Seating by Age Group

## 1999 to 2008



The vast majority of children younger than 4 years old sit in the rear seat; this remained constant for the duration of the PCPS study.

There has been a significant decrease in front-row seating among 4- to 8-year-olds.

Nearly one-third of children ages 9 to 12 (who should be restrained in the rear seat according to current recommendations) sit in the front seat.
